Withdrawal Button in your shop

Step-by-step guide for the legal requirement by § 356a BGB

Overview

This guide explains how to add a legally compliant ***Right of Withdrawal*** section to the shop footer. The section contains a styled button linking to the withdrawal form plus a text link to the Right of withdrawal page. The steps are identical for both of our themes.

Withdrawal Button

Method A

The Withdrawal button can be added by downloading and installing the **Footer Withdrawal Button** module from the Store or added manually. Once installed, the module adds the button without any manual editing of the footer content or theme styles.

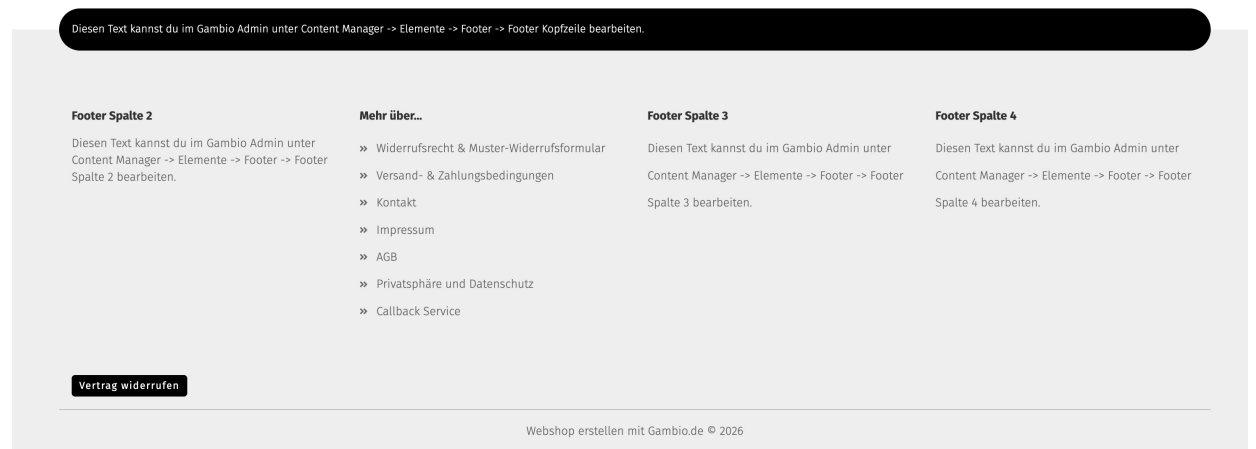


Figure 1 – Installed Withdrawal button within the Module

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You can adapt the appearance of the button in the module option after installation.

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Method B

If you use shop version **26.05.0** or newer you can follow instructions to make needed changes for your template.

Result:

After completing the steps below, Footer column 4 displays the Right of Withdrawal section with a styled button and a text link:

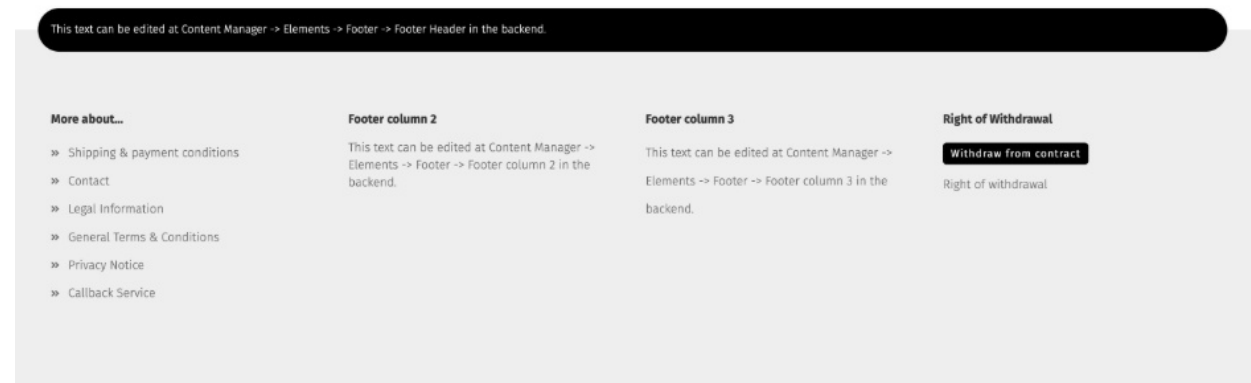


Figure 2 – Target result: the *Right of Withdrawal* section with the styled *Withdraw from contract* button.

Option 1 – via the Content Manager

This method adds the button by editing the Footer column element in the Content Manager.

Step 1 – Log in as Admin

Open the shop and log in with an administrator account.

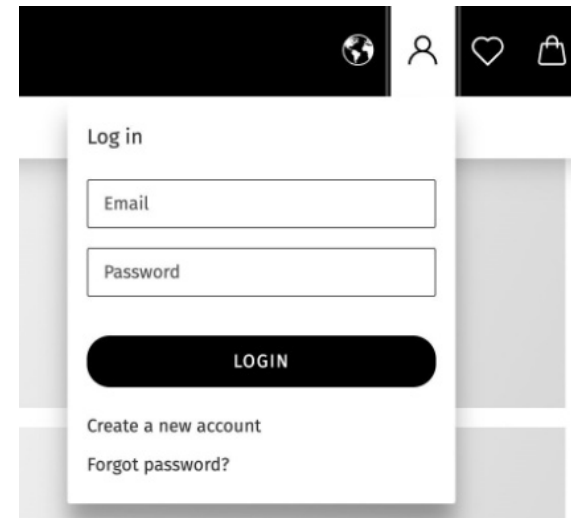


Figure 3 – Logging in to the shop.

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Step 2 – Open the Content Manager

In the admin panel, navigate to **Content > Content Manager**, then open the **Elements** tab.

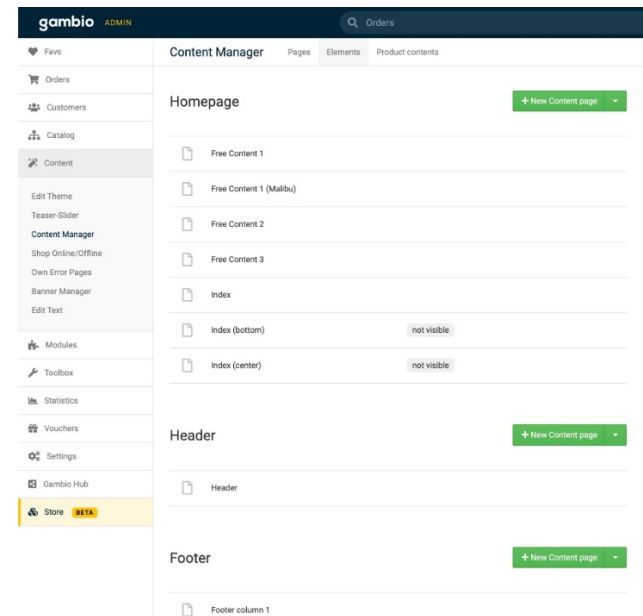


Figure 4 – Content Manager, Elements tab.

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Step 3 – Edit Footer column 4

Scroll down to the **Footer** section, hover over **Footer column 4** and click the edit (pencil) icon.

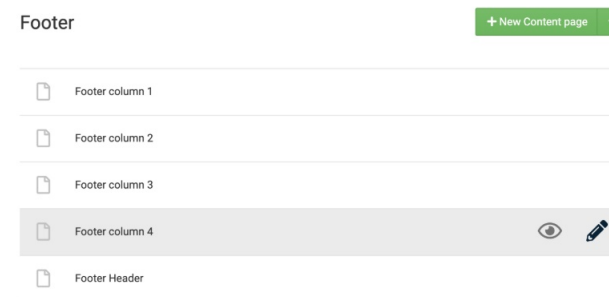


Figure 5 – Footer element list – edit Footer column 4.

Step 4 – Update labels and content for each language

Set the **Heading** to **Right of Withdrawal** and make sure Visible is enabled. Repeat this for every language tab (e.g. German and English).

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Step 5 – Paste the HTML snippet

In the content editor, switch to **HTML** mode and paste the following snippet into the Content field:

```
<ul class="footer-withdrawal">
  <li><a class="btn btn-withdrawal" href="withdrawal.php">Withdraw from contract</a></li>
  <li><a href="shop_content.php?coID=3889895">Right of withdrawal</a></li>
</ul>
```

Hinweis:

Adjust the coID value (3889895 in the example) to match the content page ID of the Right of withdrawal page in your own shop.

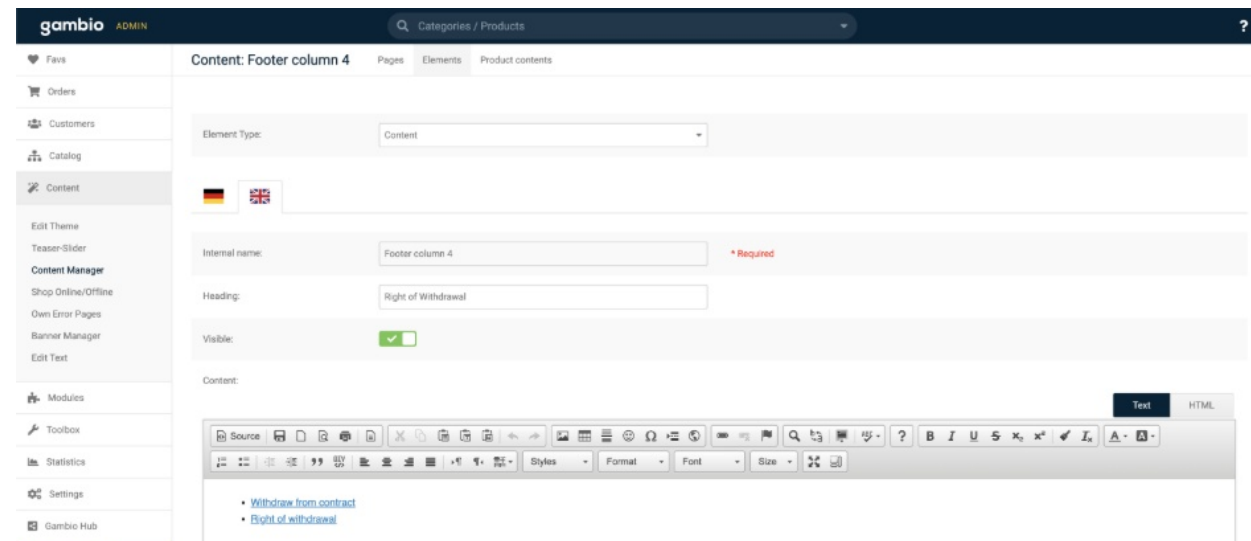


Figure 6 – Content editor showing the Withdrawal links.

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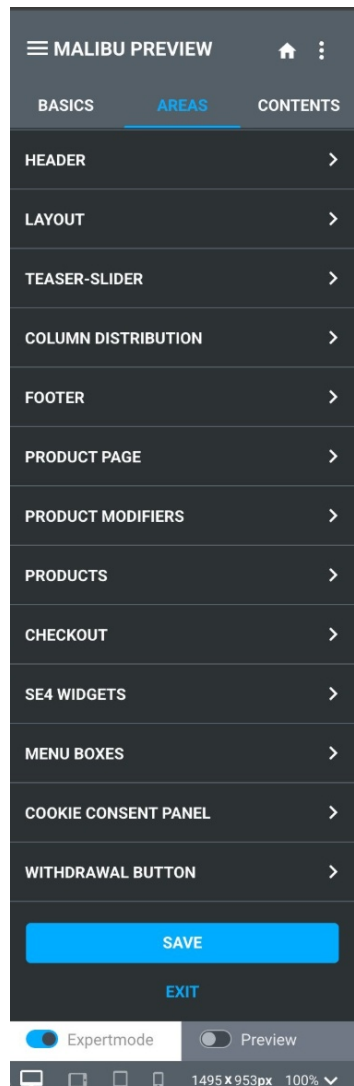


Figure 7 – Areas tab with Expertmode on – Withdrawal Button panel.

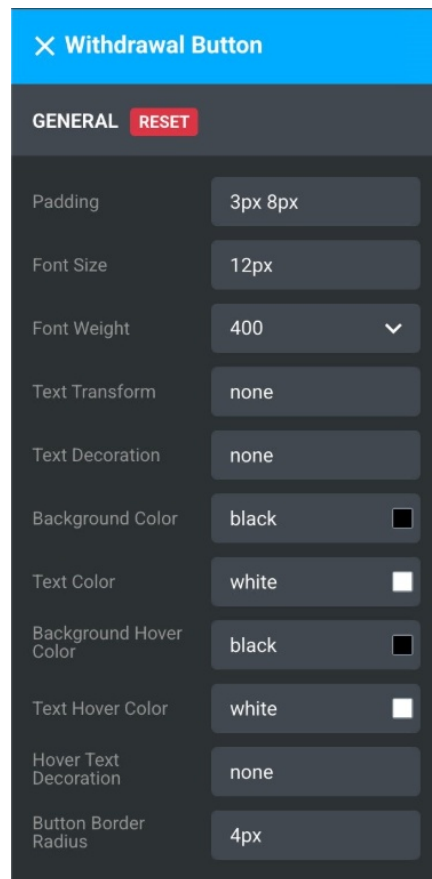


Figure 8 – Withdrawal Button styling options.

Step 6 – Save the element

Click **Update** to save the changes.

Styling the button

The button styling can be adjusted directly from the theme editor, without writing any CSS.

Open the Withdrawal Button panel

Go to **Content > Edit Theme > Areas** (make sure Expertmode is switched on), then open the Withdrawal Button panel..

Adjust the button styles

Use the available options to style the button – padding, font size, font weight, text transform, text decoration, background and text colors (including their hover states), hover text decoration and the button border radius. Adjust these to match your shop's design.

Additional custom CSS (optional)

If you need styling beyond what the panel offers, you can still add custom CSS via the theme menu > **Edit SCSS/CSS**. Target the button using the `.btn.btn-withdrawal` class.

Option 2 – via Content Zones (StyleEdit)

This method adds the Withdrawal button directly in the footer layout using Content Zones in StyleEdit.

Step 1 – Log in as Admin

Open the shop and log in with an administrator account.

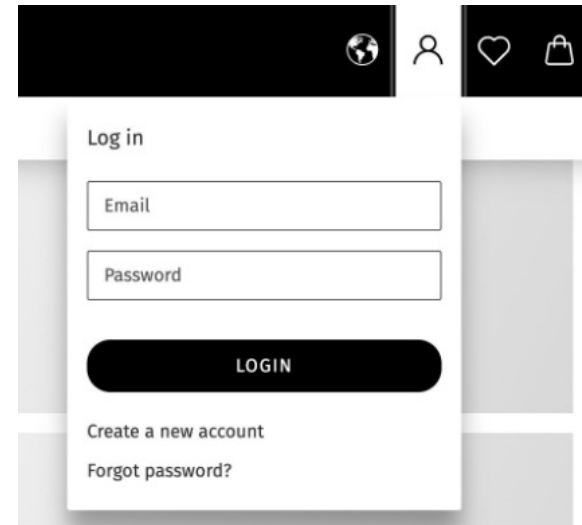


Figure 9 – Logging in to the shop.

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Step 2 – Open Edit Theme (StyleEdit)

In the admin panel, go to **Content > Edit Theme** to launch StyleEdit.

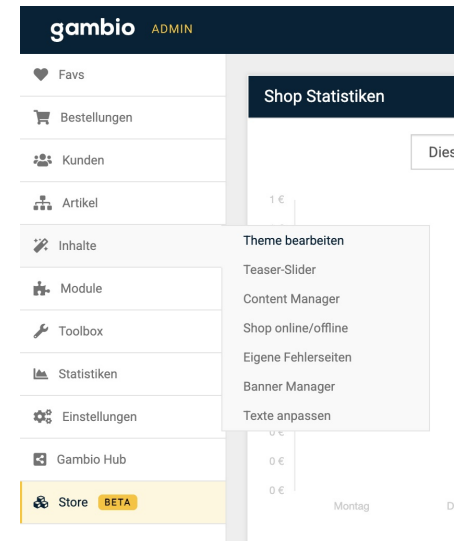


Figure 10 – Content menu: Edit Theme.

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Step 3 – Set the Footer variant to Individual

Navigate to *Areas > Footer > Variants* and choose the Individual variant.

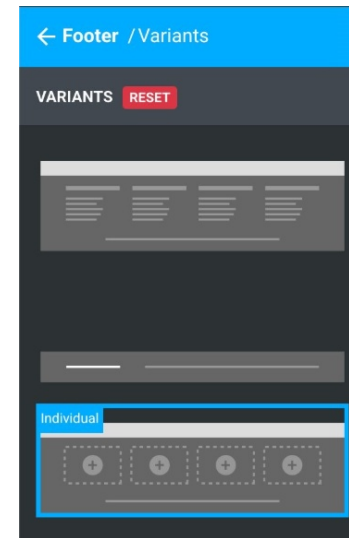


Figure 11 – Footer Variants – Individual.

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Step 4 – Wait for the new footer to load

The footer reloads with editable Content Zones, showing an HTML widget for each footer column.

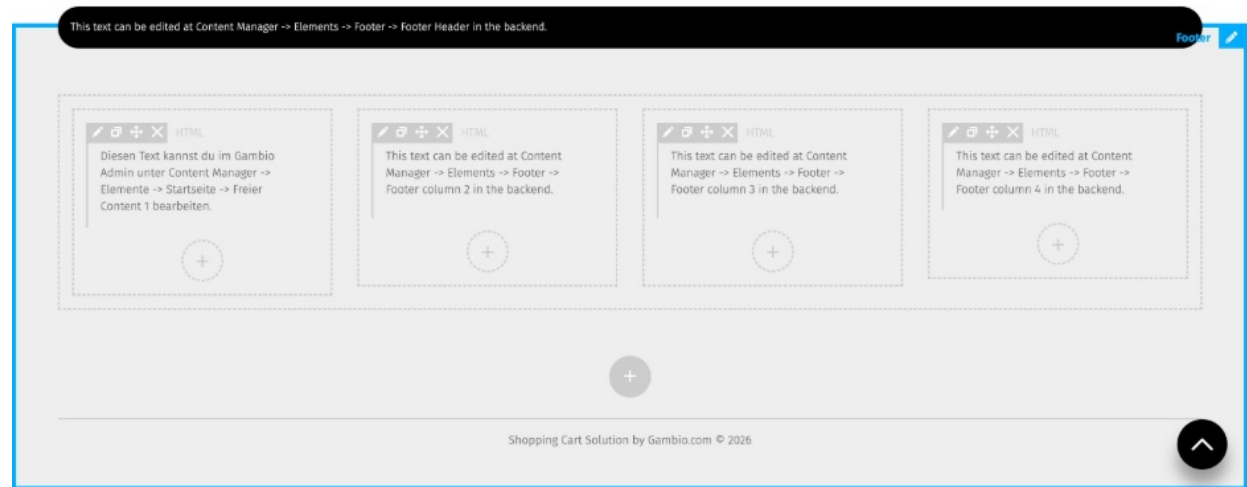


Figure 12 – Footer with editable Content Zones.

Step 5 – Edit the HTML widget for Footer column 4

On the HTML widget for Footer column 4, click the Edit (pencil) icon.

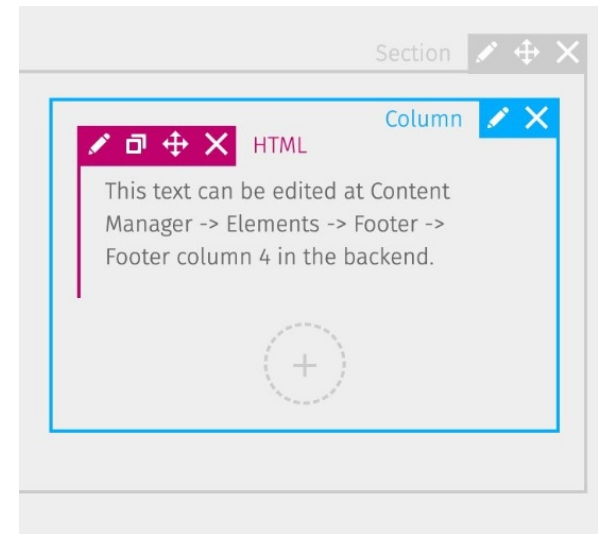


Figure 13 – Edit the HTML widget of the column.

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Step 6 – Paste the snippet for each language

Paste the snippet into the widget, using the correct labels for each language. For English:

```
<ul class="footer-withdrawal">
  <li><a class="btn btn-withdrawal" href="withdrawal.php">Withdraw from contract</a></li>
  <li><a href="shop_content.php?coID=3889895">Right of withdrawal</a></li>
</ul>
```

Hinweis:

Keep the labels compliant per language (English: *Withdraw from contract / Right of withdrawal*, German: *Vertrag widerrufen / Widerrufsbelehrung*), and adjust the coID to your shop's Right of withdrawal page ID.

Step 7 – Save

Click **Save**. The changes are published and can be reviewed on the live site.
